














## **Main Building**




Fig. 1: Main Building




Fig. 4: Head Clerk's Room




Fig. 5: Account Section (Left Side of Head Clerk's Room)






Fig. 21: Classroom A204




Fig. 24: Geography Lab




Fig. 26: Mathematics Lab




Fig. 28: Physics Lab




Fig. 30: Curve Screen Monitor




Fig. 21: Butterfly heavy duty & ladder sit-up bench




Fig. 22: Boys Common Room (Outer View)




Fig. 29: Canteen (Outer View)




Fig. 30: Canteen (Inner View)












